Unit Goals and Objectives

Goal #1

Students will understand and apply the mechanics of research and online searches. (CCG - 1)(GR5 - 2) (NETS - 1)

Objectives for Goal #1

- During class discussions, students will learn the steps in the research process and demonstrate understanding with informal surveys.
- Using a crossword puzzle, students will learn information literacy definitions as outlined by the Oregon School Library Information System (OSLIS). Student puzzles will be scored for correct answers.
- By using a class game and practice searches, students will understand what Boolean operators are and how to apply them in an online search. Students will be assessed using teacher observation and class participation.

Goal #2

Students will locate and summarize information from a variety of sources. (CCG – 1, 2) (GR5 – 1, 3, 4) (NETS – 1, 2, 3) (Big6 – 1.1, 1.2, 2.1, 2.2, 3.1, 3.2, 4.1, 4.2, 5.1) (ILS – 2, 3, 7, 8, 11)

Objectives for Goal #2

• During the research process, students will extract relevant information based on student handout and demonstrate knowledge of concepts through application of research activities. Practice worksheets and state facts activity will be assessed according to a scoring guide.

Goal #3

Students will understand how to evaluate information for accuracy. (CCG - 4) (GR5 - 6) (NETS - 1, 2, 3, 4) (Big6 - 2.2, 3.1, 3.2, 4.1, 4.2, 6.1, 6.2)(ILS - 5, 6, 7, 10, 11)

Objectives for Goal #3

• During the research process, students will evaluate their information for timeliness and accuracy based on class discussions regarding the research process. Participation in class discussions will be evaluated by teacher as well as accuracy of information during state fact activity.

Goal #4

Students will understand how to cite sources correctly. (CCG - 3) (GR5 - 5) (NETS - 4)(ILS - 8)

Objectives for Goal #4

• During the research process, students will keep track of their sources in accordance with the format the bibliography handout. Competence will be measured by bibliography sheet according to scoring guide.
